Purposes of the grant

The grant must be used for the purposes for which we awarded it. This will be the purpose that was written in your proposal. Any significant changes to the project after you have received the grant must get our written approval before you spend the award on anything different.

Aims of the grant

The aim of the award is to support the development of young people having a say over the decisions that affect them. Part of the condition of accepting this grant is that your organisation will be part of the development of a county-wide 'Youth Voice' workers network. This means you will be included on e-bulletins about 'youth voice'; be invited to network meetings (held approx. 4 times a year in Eastbourne) and have your newly



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developed 'youth voice' group featured in a county-wide 'youth voice' directory. We hope this will contribute to the success of this new project.

Indemnity and Insurance

- 1. Your organisation must have Public Liability Insurance cover with a minimum indemnity limit of £5million per claim.
- 2. Maintain Employers Liability insurance cover for volunteers.

SAFEGUARDING

You are responsible for ensuring that risk assessments are completed and that providers hold the appropriate license and insurance to deliver the activities.

The organisation must have a policy that explains how you make sure that the work you do with children and young people will be safe. It is the responsibility of the organisation to have acceptable safeguarding policies and procedures in place.

This grant is to be used for the period of 1 April 2015 until end May 2016.

A monitoring form must be completed by the organisation and returned no later than 2 weeks after the end date of your project. We are required to report back to the funders and therefor if you do not complete the monitoring forms you may be asked to return the grant.

COMPLETION OF PROJECT


Call for Development Sites

Consultation with Year 6 at Salehurst Primary School

Salehurst & Robertsbridge Neighbourhood Plan: trees and hedgerows in your ownership

As I'm sure you know, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group appointed by the Parish Council has been gathering evidence from enquiries, exhibitions and questionnaires over the last twenty months, in order to formulate what they believe are appropriate policies for the parish.

One of the policies (shown in full below) in the Environment section is to designate for extra protection certain trees and hedgerows in the Parish. The purpose of this letter is to let you know that a tree, or trees or hedgerow we would wish to benefit from protection is located on a parcel of land which we believe you own or occupy.

The Draft Neighbourhood Plan which contains this policy was open for public consultation between 26th September and 7th November, and we are now in the process of refining it in response to comments received, to go to the next stage in the creation of a formal, legally binding Neighbourhood Plan. At the time of consultation we had not drawn up a full Schedule 4 list of trees or hedgerows to go in the Plan. However we have now done this work and invite you to let us know your views about the inclusion of the trees or hedgerows on your land.

If you are the occupier, rather than the owner, I would be grateful if you could send a copy of this letter to the owner, as the considerations set out here will apply to them as well as you. Details of your site, or sites, are shown at the foot of this letter. You can see in full the current draft Neighbourhood Plan and the proposed list of trees and hedgerows on our website at: http://www.robertsbridgeneighbourhoodplan.org.uk

Tree / hedgerow location:

T5: Heathfield Gardens
Mature horse chestnut in prominent position at centre of estate

G9 Bishops Lane eastern end, south side Extensive belt of mature oaks and other species Bordering Heathfield Gardens

The draft policy is as follows:

Policy EN9: Local listing of trees and hedgerows outside the Conservation area

The Plan designates the trees and hedgerows as listed in Schedule 4 as locally listed. Development that would result in the loss of these trees and hedgerows, or those subsequently listed by any relevant authority, will not be supported. Development requiring planning permission that damages or results in the loss of trees or hedgerows of arboricultural and amenity value will not be permitted unless the benefits of the proposed development outweigh the amenity value of the protected trees. Development proposals must be designed to retain trees or hedgerows of good arboricultural and amenity value. Development proposals should be accompanied by a survey that establishes the health and longevity of any affected trees or hedgerows and a management plan to demonstrate how they will be so maintained.

The Salehurst and Robertsbridge Character Assessment (see evidence base) will be used as a reference to assess the impact of the proposals.


